	<p><b>Stage 7 cena</b>  <b>New language features:</b> sentence pattern, accusative + verb, perfect tense (irregular)  <b>Practising the language:</b> identify and translate singular and plural, identify missing words, translate sentences  <b>Vocabulary:</b> 20 new words  <b>Translating:</b> 4 Latin stories  <b>Demonstrating knowledge of Roman civilisation:</b> Roman religion (beliefs about life after death and funeral rituals)</p>

	<p><b>Stage 9 thermae</b>  <b>New language features:</b> dative singular and plural  <b>Practising the language:</b> identify and translate dative and pronouns, identify missing words, translate sentences  <b>Vocabulary:</b> 22 new words  <b>Translating:</b> 3 Latin stories  <b>Demonstrating knowledge of Roman civilisation:</b> The Roman baths</p>

	<p><b>Stage 11 candidati</b>  <b>New language features:</b> intransitive verbs with dative, sentence patterns with dative case, dative plural pronouns, asking questions in Latin  <b>Practising the language:</b> identify and translate dative case and questions, identify missing words, translate sentences  <b>Vocabulary:</b> 24 new words  <b>Translating:</b> 2 Latin stories  <b>Demonstrating knowledge of Roman civilisation:</b> Pompeii: elections and government</p>
	<p><b>Stage 12 Vesuvius</b>  <b>New language features:</b> imperfect and perfect tense (1st and 2nd person singular and plural) + to be in the imperfect tense  <b>Practising the language:</b> identify and translate verb tenses, identify missing words, translate sentences  <b>Vocabulary:</b> 25 new words  <b>Translating:</b> 4 Latin stories  <b>Demonstrating knowledge of Roman civilisation:</b> The eruption of Vesuvius; the destruction and excavation of Pompeii</p>
