LISTENING TO & APPRAISING MUSIC

Learning Objectives	Activities
 Listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory. Appreciate and begin to understand a wide range of live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians. Develop an understanding of the history of music. 	 Children listen to recorded extracts of music with a focus on verbal responses whilst being encouraged to find words and phrases to describe the music using taught vocabulary. Discussions allow students to explain their reasoning and choices. Evaluation of performances continue, with final compositions becoming more successful as a result. Listening to a wide range of musical styles and genres from a variety of eras allows for the understanding of key features and characteristics that identify them.
