LISTENING TO & APPRAISING MUSIC

Learning Objectives	Activities
 Listen with an increasing attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory. Appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians. Develop an in-depth understanding of the history of music. 	 Students continue to learn appropriate musical vocabulary and terminology to promote verbal responses to music. They continue to increase their understanding of music through time, their characteristics and instruments and identify musical differences between contrasting genres and ears.

PERFORMING MUSIC

Learning Objectives	Activities
 Play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression. Use and understand staff and other musical notations. 	 Opportunities to perform from traditional staff notation are introduced incorporating rests, basic syncopation and more complex melodies. They continue to perform pieces with different layers. Various opportunities to sing in harmony are provided including moments of overlapping songs (such as Land of the Silver Birch" and My Paddle's Keen and Bright")

CREATING MUSIC

Learning Objectives	Activities
 Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music. Use and understand staff and other musical notations. Compose using various types of notations. 	 Opportunities to continue to work on greater control and sophistication when combining sounds are provided throughout the year. Composing using specific features of specific genres and musical styles is introduced. Children have opportunities to compose using the techniques that are performed, including harmony and layering, notating compositions on traditional staff notation.
