

famous herself as an outspoken socialite and author.

She would often launch their careers by introducing them to the artistic and literary society of London during salon dinners at her Bedford Square home. Lady Morrell was also an accomplished photographer.

The house later became the home of the former Liberal Prime Minister Herbert Asquith who led Britain Lady Ottoline Morrell with her into the First World War, and his wife Margot who was daughter Julian in front of 44 Bedford Square, 1909 Fun Fact: Margot Asquith was a staunch opponent of women's suffrage while her husband

was Prime Minister, and her opinions were often considered so scandalous that the negative reaction to her may have led to her husband's political downfall (and ironically to a new government which gave the vote to women for the first time in the United Kingdom)!
